ORDER ON PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR SUPPLEMENTAL ACCOUNTING

On February 25, 1971, the plaintiffs, The San Carlos Apache Tribes, et al. filed a motion for a supplemental accounting. The defendant, the United States responded to that motion on December 26, 1973.

The issues raised appearing identical to issues decided in <u>Blackfeet</u> and <u>Gros Ventre Tribes v. United States</u>, 32 Ind. Cl. Comm. 65, 76 (1973), we follow that decision. We hold the defendant to be accountable for trust assets other than money. We require that full information be supplied concerning the funds of plaintiff in the hands of the defendant, whether or not deposited in the Treasury. As to the request for a post-1946 accounting, the limitations on the jurisdiction of the Commission have been recognized by us in previous rulings and will be adhered to in this case.

IT IS ORDERED that the plaintiffs' motion for a supplemental accounting of defendant's management and disposal of plaintiff's property other than money is granted. Plaintiffs' motion for a supplemental accounting of defendant's receipt of plaintiffs' funds not deposited to the credit of plaintiffs in the United States Treasury is granted. Plaintiffs' motion for an accounting to date is denied.
