ORDER MAKING SHOW CAUSE ORDER ABSOLUTE AND
DISMISSING POST-1951 ACCOUNTING CLAIM

The Commission issued an order on November 20, 1975, for plaintiff to show cause why its claim in this docket for a post-1951 accounting should not be dismissed. 37 Ind. Cl. Comm. 94. Plaintiff filed its response to our show cause order on February 5, 1976, and defendant filed its reply on July 6, 1976.

Having considered the record as a whole, and being fully informed in the premises, for the reasons expressed in the accompanying opinion, which are hereby made a part of this order, we conclude that plaintiff has failed to offer the proof required in order to show cause why the claim hereunder for a post-1951 accounting should not be dismissed.
